

### THE BFI NATIONAL LOTTERY FILMMAKING FUND



### INTRODUCTION

The BFI awards National Lottery funding UK-wide in order to help build a diverse and accessible screen culture that benefits all of society and contributes to a prosperous UK economy. We have National Lottery players to thank for contributing to this good cause funding.

The new BFI National Lottery Filmmaking Fund has £54 million to support UK films and talent over three years. Backing distinctive projects from adventurous storytellers across a range of genres, approaches and perspectives, which reflect and represent a wide range of voices and backgrounds.

Funding supports live-action and animation shorts and features, documentaries, immersive work and professional development, all funding decisions are guided by our fund priorities:

## **DEVELOPMENT FUND**

Flexible and broad, funding can support a range of costs at all stages of development. Aiming to support around 60-70 projects per year, there is a focus on backing projects that are unlikely to be commercially or privately financed at an early stage.

This rolling fund is currently open.



## **DISCOVERY FUND**

For directorial debuts with projects budgeted up to £3.5m. Awarding up to £1m per project. Assessment of applications will focus strongly on the talent involved and their progression, as well as on the strength of the project itself. Through championing under-represented talent earlier in their careers, we can help create a more diverse and inclusive film industry.

Fund is currently closed, with the next funding round opening in summer 2023.



### **IMPACT FUND**

For second-time directors and beyond, working at any budget level, as well as directorial debuts budgeted over £3.5m. Funding awards will recognise the potential that projects have for impact at scale – culturally, socially, and commercially – as well as potential impact on the filmmaker's careers.

This rolling fund is currently open.



# CREATIVE CHALLENGE FUND

Opening later in 2023, this will award funding to successful production companies and screen organisations to create time-specific labs and development programmes. These will aim to support a range of projects, helping filmmakers move their work forward in dynamic ways beyond script-based work.




### DOCUMENTARY FUND

The BFI Doc Society Fund supports and nurtures independent non-fiction film by UK filmmakers, prioritising expansive, director-led storytelling. The Fund comprises a features fund, the Made of Truth shorts fund for new and emerging filmmakers, and a talent support programme all enabled by the National Lottery. Our funding is intended to be transformative and representative of all UK society.

### **BFI NETWORK**

For emerging filmmakers, BFI NETWORK will fund live action and animation shorts and early feature development and professional development programmes.
